Message from the Manse



and all the very best for 2018!

As always, the New Year begins with the celebration of The Epiphany: the visit of the Magi (or 'Wise Men') to the infant Jesus.

This event is often tagged onto the end of the familiar Christmas narrative and may be very familiar to many of you. That said, its importance is often overlooked. Understandably, our focus in Advent and at Christmas is the coming of the Messiah – God incarnate. Our thoughts rest on Mary

and Joseph, shepherds and angels. At times the coming of the Magi can feel almost like an after-thought.

Yet Matthew 2: 1-12 tells of the first manifestation of the infant Jesus to the gentiles. They saw and followed a light in the sky, and the end of their journey shows them kneeling before God incarnate – the light of the world. They were strangers from a distant land. They were not followers of Judaism. For all their riches they were, in their way, very unlikely people to be among the first to meet Jesus.

What about us? As we move into the New Year, we continue to celebrate that glorious new beginning, the moment when God breaks into the world in the shape of Jesus. Like the Magi we travel on a journey: carrying with us all our life experience: the good and the bad. Like the Magi we each bring our gifts: some of them may be very clear and obvious; others more hidden but just as visible to the God who knows us better than we know ourselves.

As I reflect on my own experiences during Advent this year I am left with the reminder that ours is a God of surprises. A God who chooses some of the most unlikely people imaginable to be part of his story: the young, unmarried woman; the simple carpenter; the shepherds – unclean and banned from entering the temple - find a welcome in the birth-place of God's Son; the Magi cast aside societal barriers of race and religion to present themselves to Jesus.

As we begin a New Year together, may we be always on the look-out for God in unexpected people and places; and be quick to see the gifts and graces of all whom we meet.
