Message from the Manse

What's your story?

Storytelling is, and has always been, a major part of our culture. Anyone who has ever stayed up until the early hours with a book they 'just can't put down', or read (or told) a particularly gripping story to a small child, can attest to that. I remember listening to my Nan – who had a real knack for storytelling – talk about her own childhood in such a way that I could imagine the actions and behaviours of people I'd never met but felt I knew even if they died decades before I was born. Many of us will know of a friend or relative with a special gift for weaving a tale; someone able to bring a story to life. Maybe you are one of those people yourself!

Most of the best stories are at least based on reality. You may remember that last year the children and young people of the Methodist Church in Britain challenged the adult members throughout the Connexion to share stories of how God had touched their lives and how they had seen God at work in the world. By the time 3Generate – the young people's yearly national Conference – met in Southport last November more than 1200 letters had been received.

That is, of course, a phenomenal achievement in its own right. So much wisdom and encouragement shared. However, such was the success of the project that the young people of 3Generate suggested to the Methodist Conference that the year 2019 – 2020 be declared 'A Year of Testimony'. The national church accepted the challenge and the President and Vice President of the Conference have taken the theme 'What's your story?' for this year.

Testimony. For many of us even the word 'testimony' is uncomfortable. Perhaps we imagine that in order to have a testimony a person must have had a massive life-change or even a 'lightning bolt moment' of new-found faith akin to that experienced by Paul on the road to Damascus. We might imagine that a testimony of God working in and through the lives of ordinary people isn't worth listening to.

That isn't true!

Our stories are the most powerful tools we have when it comes to sharing our faith. The telling and sharing of our stories - not just the nice, comfortable bits but the parts we perhaps wish weren't there - not only deepens relationships and enables others to open up, it also dispels the myth that Christians 'have it all sorted', instead drawing attention to why we need God in our lives! Not to mention it's very difficult to argue with another person's lived experience.

Of course, a short account of a time when you felt particularly close to God, or particularly grateful to God, is as much a testimony as a twenty-minute life story. In fact, I'd be tempted to suggest the shorter a testimony is, the more likely people are to listen!

As I said, some people have a real talent for storytelling and keeping alive memories of others; but all of us have the ability to share our own stories and in doing so keep alive the story of God.

And all of us have a story worth telling.
