# Message from the Manse

"And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: 'Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown.'
And he replied:

'Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way."

It was 1939 and King George VI faced the challenge of giving his Christmas radio broadcast to an Empire facing the uncertainties of war. George VI was reluctantly thrust into the spotlight following the abdication of his elder brother; he wasn't brought up to rule and lived with a life-long stammer. During this challenging Christmas speech he quoted an obscure poem his wife had found in an unknown book a few days earlier.

Minnie Haskins, then aged 64, wasn't near a radio at the time of the broadcast. It wasn't until a few hours later that she heard a summary of what had been said and realized the King had used her words. Overnight a poem written by a woman few people had heard of, and published 27

years earlier in a book that received little or no acclaim, became one of the most quoted works of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century.

You'll know by now that we explored the image of Jesus as 'Light of the World' for our Advent and Christmas services, and this theme extends into Epiphany as we celebrate Magi who travelled to Jesus from a distant land. They were strangers, yet they saw, identified and followed a light in the sky. A light that guided them on the journey of a lifetime: a journey that ended with them kneeling at the feet of God incarnate – the light of the world.

At Christmas 1939 an unlikely King quoted an unlikely poet who spoke of an unlikely God. A God who came to those whom society deemed less than worthy: the unmarried woman, the simple carpenter, the unclean shepherds, the foreign Magi. Each with so much to lose, each gaining more from his coming than they could possibly imagine. Inviting them to put their hands into his and be guided.

As we enter this New Year, may the God who is full of surprises bless us too in ways that are beyond our expectations, hopes and dreams, and may he use us in unimaginable ways.

We put our hand in his and trust in him.

The Centre is open six days a week, (10am – 4pm Monday to Friday and 10am – 12noon on Saturday) and the Coffee Bar is staffed entirely by volunteers from the local churches and community.

Volunteers serve together with another person and work for 2-hour slots (10am -12noon, 12noon – 2pm and 2pm-4pm). Each day is different however! Serving drinks, washing up and being a friendly face for visitors are the main tasks.

If you think you might be interested in volunteering, either regularly or from time to time, please get in touch with Mandy at the Pastoral Centre or speak to Veronica Hickox in church. If you are new to the area volunteering could provide the opportunity to make new friends. Or perhaps you might consider volunteering with a friend or neighbour to cover a shift together once a month?

### **United Choir**

In 1974, the Methodist Church Council and Anglican PCC agreed on the path of closer co-operation between our two churches; this special relationship of course still exists today. As part of that journey, the United Choir was formed to sing at all the joint services. We have sung at the two evening services in the Methodist Church ever since then, and in the second Sunday morning service in St James with the St James Choir.

The choir has singers from both churches and in the past has had members from the Catholic and Baptist and United Reformed Churches. We really don't think of ourselves in denominational terms – we are just the United Choir.

We have had many an adventure along the way and have filled many an ecumenical gap. We have sung for the Catholic mass for the Blessed Margaret Pole in Warblington, in the United Reformed Church, and in many of the fifth Sunday United Services wherever they have been.



We have sung for the Wesley Guilds in Havant and Hayling Island, and two broadcast occasions, one a live broadcast from the Emsworth shore, and the other a Songs of Praise from St James. We have sung for many charity events in Emsworth, most notably Betty Bruton's concerts, but also further afield, raising much money for good causes. Advent and Garden occasions brought our congregations together informally.

Perhaps the most notable occasion for us was the rededication of the Methodist Church in May 1982 after the reordering to become the Pastoral Centre during the week, when the Hon George Thomas, the then Speaker of the House of Commons was present.

We have had music written for us by Alan Jackson, Hugh Benzie and Dot Warren. Win Field included us in her Christmas and Easter productions. The Good Friday presentations started in 1992 following Win Field's visions for various united groups to explore the Easter/Lent themes through music, art and poetry. The United Choir has invited singers from all our churches and the community since then and hopefully this will continue.

The time has now come after 45 years for the United Choir to retire gracefully – numbers are too low to sustain our standards. We hope to

continue singing with St James Choir on second Sunday mornings. Our last evening as the United Choir will be on January 26<sup>th</sup> at the Methodist Church for the United Service at the end of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

## **Petersfield Methodist Church Coach Holiday to Derbyshire**

Willersley Castle, a magnificent 18th century Grade II\* listed castle is set in 60 acres on a hillside overlooking Cromford, in the heart of the Derwent Valley World Heritage Site. This will be our base from Saturday  $18^{th}$  to Saturday  $25^{th}$  July 2020.

The hotel has a 15-metre heated indoor swimming pool. All rooms in the hotel and The Mews are ensuite with tea/coffee facilities & TV. The price is £749 per person for seven nights Dinner, Bed & Breakfast, with no single supplement, and includes return travel from Petersfield Methodist Church and five full day excursions. National Trust members will receive a discount of £25. Other pickup points are Liss, Alton, Basingstoke, Newbury Wharf and Stratford upon Avon.

The programme will include Hardwick Hall, Biddulf Grange, Kelham Island Museum Sheffield, Buxton, and the National Memorial Arboretum and Chesterfield. There will also be evening talks and entertainment, and a free day giving time to visit the mill, take a barge ride on the Cromford Canal, or join your Leader for a guided local walk.
