# Message from the Manse

`Now it passes on and I begin to lose it,' the Rat said presently. `O Mole! the beauty of it! The merry bubble and joy, the thin, clear, happy call of the distant piping! Such music I never dreamed of, and the call in it is stronger even than the music is sweet! Row on, Mole, row! For the music and the call must be for us.'

The Mole, greatly wondering, obeyed. `I hear nothing myself,' he said, `but the wind playing in the reeds and rushes and osiers.'

The Rat never answered, if indeed he heard. Rapt, transported, trembling, he was possessed in all his senses by this new divine thing that caught up his helpless soul and swung and dandled it, a powerless but happy infant in a strong sustaining grasp.

From chapter 7 of 'The Wind in the Willows' by Kenneth Grahame

If you know the story of 'The Wind in the Willows' then you will probably know the context of this quote. The Rat and the Mole, worried about the young son of their friend the Otter, leave their home on the riverbank late one night to go in search for him. As they float along in the half-light the Rat begins to hear more clearly the music of the river and its call towards the lost child. Eventually, the baby otter is found, quite safe, asleep in the presence of 'Pan' the ancient Greek god of the wild. Afterwards, the Rat

and the Mole don't recall the events of the night, only remembering that something wonderful happened.

In this story one of these animals simply hears the sounds of nature, beautiful though they are, while the other is enraptured by beautiful and powerful music that speaks to his soul. At 'Sending Ripples' in February we talked about the Friedrich Nietzsche quote: 'and those who were seen dancing were thought to be insane by those who could not hear the music.'

It would be easy for the Mole to 'pooh-pooh' his friend's enthusiasm. Music? What music? Don't be so silly. It would also be easy for the Rat to keep quiet, not mentioning what he hears for fear of ridicule. In the end, because of the understanding they share and the strength of their relationship both of them find themselves in what they consider to be a holy place, and eventually the Mole hears music too.

Both 'The Wind in the Willows' and Nietzsche remind us that God speaks to each of us in different ways. We may not always understand one another's behaviour or reactions. Our calling as a Christian community isn't to all see things in the same way (how boring would that be?!) but to affirm and uphold one another, even and perhaps especially when we struggle to see each other's point of view.

If you've never read the Wind in the Willows as an adult (or have never read it at all) then I recommend picking up a copy this Lent.

#### **Lent Communions**

There will be a series of six Lent Communions this year, at 1pm on Tuesdays, starting on 3rd March. These will be held in International Hall and offer the chance for folk to share in a Ploughman's Lunch in the Pastoral Centre beforehand if they would like to.

Bill Stillwell will lead the first and last ones, and John Harwood has offered to lead one too. During the middle of Lent, Peter Cole will develop a theme over three consecutive Tuesdays. In these three linked communions Peter hopes to enable people to re-connect the physical and the spiritual whilst drawing out the Lent themes of repentance, presence and resurrection. Each service will focus on one of our senses: Touch, Hearing and Taste. Peter will gently explore these in a variety of ways, including a simple communion liturgy written for the series.

# Report from the meeting on 16<sup>th</sup> January 2020

**Review of recent activities** – Although not strictly part of the brief for CTE, the switching-on of Christmas lights in The Square had been well supported by CTE and it was felt there was a good Christian input. **Review of Christmas card distribution** – This had gone smoothly but some of the deliverers are unable to continue so new deliverers are required for the Easter cards. If you can help, please speak to Sue D who has a list of the roads now requiring cover.

**Week of Prayer for Christian Unity** – At the time of our CTE meeting the arrangements were all in hand for the service at the Baptist Church on 18<sup>th</sup> January. The service for the end of the week to be held at the Methodist Church in the evening – this would also be the last service for the United Choir after 45 years. Our Chair also reported that a prayer gathering for ordained and other church leaders, 18 in all, had been held recently and was much appreciated.

**Arrangements for Easter cards** - are well in hand.

**Arrangements for Easter –** Good Friday – Correspondence had been received giving two points of view for the Walk of Witness and each was considered. A small working party will be convened to finalise the details. However, it was agreed that the walk would follow much the same route as 2019 but ending in The Square. Each church to walk to the starting point from their own church, ideally with suitable banners, meeting at 10.30am at the URC. Coffee and hot cross buns will be provided by the Methodist Church.

Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> April – Laura, Heather (Baptist Church) and Jo (Anglican Church) are planning another event along the millpond wall from 10am – 1pm. Details are still to be finalised.

Easter Sunday foreshore service 6am – Laura will provide food and give the talk. Music, amplification and service sheets will be provided by the Anglican Church and Revd Andrew Sheard will lead. A better amplification system may be explored.

**Website report** – It was noted that there was more traffic around church festivals but, in general, the amount of interest was encouraging. We were reminded to keep Stuart informed of suitable events and to remember the CTE Facebook page.

**Christian Aid** – There was no report, but it was understood that in lieu of Lent Lunches this year people will be encouraged to donate a suggested amount of 40p per day.

**Confirmation of fifth Sunday services** – 29/3/20 at St Thomas à Becket, Warblington, with The Cross of Christ service of readings and anthems. 31/5/20 at the Baptist Church; 30/8/20 at New Life Church prior to the Emsworth Show (our Chair will speak to the New Life Church about this); 29/11/20 at St Thomas a Becket, Warblington, for an Advent Carol Service as part of *Becket 850*.

**Any Other Business** – Fairtrade Fortnight 24<sup>th</sup> February – 8<sup>th</sup> March. Flyers were distributed by Maureen (Catholic Church) to the representatives from the other churches.

A refugee Syrian family is to be housed in Emsworth through the Community sponsorship scheme and will need much support, particularly for the first six months.

A one-day Southern Harbours Event is to be held at the Baptist Church on 28/3/20.

The Good News cards will be at the URC on 6<sup>th</sup> March from 10am – 1pm.

#### **News from around the Churches**

<u>Anglican Church</u> – A year of commemorating the 850<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Thomas à Becket's death is planned, including a pilgrimage to Canterbury. Details will be circulated widely. Free drinks and mince pies to visitors before Christmas were much appreciated. There is the possibility of Breakfast Church worship on at least 2 Sundays per month in future at St James'.

<u>Baptist Church</u> – Christianity Explored and Youth Alpha each happening.

<u>Catholic Church</u> – The Church is still keen to host a non-eucharistic service, but this must be deferred until after building works are completed.

<u>Methodist Church</u> – Andrew de Ville has been appointed as Chair of the Southampton District.
